

Guidelines for Offering College-Level Courses at the College of Electrical and Computer Engineering of National Chiao Tung University

Discussed and approved at the 1st Executive Board Meeting of the college in the 2004 academic year (September 21)

Revised and approved at the 2nd Teaching and Course Committee meeting in the 2004 academic year (November 11)

Approved at the 3rd College Affairs Committee meeting in the 2004 academic year (January 13)

1. The purpose of establishing college-level courses is to enable students of this college to acquire the basic professional knowledge of other colleges. These course-offering guidelines are formulated particularly for facilitating the operation of college-level courses.
2. College-level courses are arranged and formulated by the college teaching and course committee based on the complementariness with existing courses or the need for interdisciplinary teaching.
3. College-level courses are listed independently in the curriculum of each semester. In addition, the courses are incorporated into the curriculum of each department for the selection of students.
4. The time of college-level course arrangement shall comply with the “Course Period and Classroom Arrangements of National Chiao Tung University.”
5. Limitations on the number of course takers are based on the characteristics of each course, and are determined by the college teaching and course committee.
6. Before March 15 every year, the college teaching and course committee incorporates and discusses the opinions of each department, and proposes the titles, syllabi, and prerequisite requirements of the college-level courses of the next academic year.
7. These guidelines were formulated by the college teaching and course committee and approved at a College Affairs Committee meeting before being implemented. Revisions to the guidelines shall undergo the same procedure.
