

# **Regulations for Electing Representatives for the University Assembly Meetings, College of Electrical and Computer Engineering, National Chiao Tung University**

Discussed at the 2nd College Affairs Committee meeting of the 2007 academic year (June 14)

Approved at the 2nd College Executive Board meeting of the 2007 academic year (September 27)

Approved at the 1st College Affairs Committee meeting of the 2007 academic year (December 11)

1. These regulations were formulated based on the “Guidelines for Electing University Assembly Representatives and Members of University-Level Committees at National Chiao Tung University.”
2. The candidates for the University Assembly representatives of the University must be full-time teachers (lecturer or higher) of the College. Permission from the individual in question is required before the individual is listed as a candidate.
3. Teachers who are on secondment, further studies, military service, or study leave cannot be listed as candidates.
4. Electors must be full-time teachers (lecturer or higher) of the College.
5. Open voting is adopted in the election, and electors can select six candidates at most on each ballot. The ballots are printed by the College Office and they become effective only when stamped with the college seal. Ballots not signed, not signed after revision, or copied are considered invalid.
6. Candidates are elected according to the numbers of ballots they win in the college election; however, every department is guaranteed two representatives in the University Assembly. If candidates receive the same number of ballots, the final decision is attained by drawing lots.
7. If an elected member for some reason cannot hold the position, the vacant position shall be filled by the candidate with the next highest number of votes.
8. The term of the elected teacher representatives of the University Assembly is two years. Every year, half of the representatives are reelected.
9. Matters not specified in these regulations shall be settled according to relevant laws and regulations.
10. These regulations were approved at a College Affairs Committee meeting, and will be

implemented after being approved for future reference at a University Assembly meeting.  
Revisions to the regulations shall undergo the same procedure.
